



Fixed Term Exclusion Information

The information below is intended as a guide to support those parents/carers who have children who have received a fixed term exclusion. You will receive an initial telephone call explaining the exclusion followed by a formal letter.

The school realises that exclusions can be upsetting for you and your family, but the decision to exclude your son/daughter has not been taken lightly. You have a duty to ensure that your child is not present in a public place in school hours during this exclusion unless there is reasonable justification for this. Failure to comply is a criminal offence.

The school will set work for students to be completed during the exclusion. This will be available on Google Classrooms. Please ensure that work set by the school is completed.

You have the right to make representations about this decision to the governing body. If you wish to make representations please contact Mrs Loy, Clerk to the Governors, at the school (email address: clerk@springfield.uk.net) as soon as possible.

You should be aware that if you think the exclusion has occurred as a result of discrimination, you may make a claim under the Equality Act 2010 to the First Tier Tribunal (Special Educational Needs and Disability), in the case of disability discrimination, or the County Court, in the case of other forms of discrimination (<http://www.justice.gov.uk/guidance/courts-and-tribunals/tribunals/send/index.htm>). A claim of discrimination made under these routes should be lodged within six months of the date on which the discrimination is alleged to have taken place, e.g. the day on which the pupil was excluded. Making a claim would not affect your right to make representations to the discipline committee.

Your son/daughter will be required to attend a formal reintegration interview with a senior member of staff. Details will be confirmed by telephone and/or within the exclusion letter. If the interview date/time is not convenient, please contact the school to arrange a suitable alternative. The purpose of the reintegration interview is to discuss how best your child's return to school can be managed. Your child's readmission will be dependent on them agreeing to conform to and comply with the school's policies.
