Dear Parent/Carer

I am writing to you on behalf of the Violence Reduction Partnership about the knife crime awareness campaign, Operation Sceptre, that is running from 13th – 19th November in England and Wales. This is a national week of action to help tackle knife crime.

This week, there will be lots of activities, including police operations, surrender bins, knife searches, education and talks for young people. Our aim is to educate children that they are safer not carrying knives, and to help them walk away from harm.

We know that very few young people carry knives, but when it happens, knife crime can have devastating impacts. We are working hard to drive down knife carrying. It is against the law to carry a knife for your protection. We are asking all parents and carers to talk to their children about this issue, understand what is going on for them, and seek help if you are worried. It is unlikely that your child is carrying a knife, but perhaps they know someone who does. Here are some useful resources:
