### HELLO TO ALL PORTSMOUTH SCHOOLS WITH SERVICE CHILDREN.

April saw the Month of the Military Child with schools across Portsmouth celebrating the uniqueness of Service Life. Some schools held assemblies, inviting in Serving parents or Veterans to talk about their life in the Armed Forces, others held special lunches or dressed in purple for the day. Many schools took part in the Never Such Innocence Poetry competition and were recently invited to HMS Nelson to perform their thought provoking and emotional poetry. Here they were also joined by the HMS Oardacious crew, who spoke to the children about their EPIC 3000-mile row across the Atlantic, which was to raise awareness for the Mental Health and Wellbeing of Service Personnel and their families as well as raising awareness of the support out their for our fantastic Service Children and their families. They are setting their oars into action again in December – so get your cheering hats out and banners at the ready – you can follow their progress and cheer them on!

They were also joined by Penny Mordant MP, who recently met with PMK to discuss the work we do and the support that is out there for our Service families and schools. Penny spoke about her own Service in the Royal Navy Reserves and that she now has an honorary commission. She inspired the children to follow what they love and are passionate about.

Never Such Innocence is a charity who work alongside the MOD and can offer creative workshops to schools and help schools understand the struggles of SPP pupils and offer ideas on how is best to support them. Aggies aim to provide termly events to bring SPP pupils together and allow trips specifically for SPP children in the PMK cluster, free of charge with schools arranging transport to and from venues. During May, we were lucky enough to go to Fort Nelson for a bespoke day, with 2 trips, one for KS2 and the other for KS3. The children who attended had a fantastic time, imagining the sea levels had risen and they were living on an island called Fort Neslonia. They were able to use their imaginations and create artwork of new creatures that might live on the island as well as ancient maps – all of this was put together to create posters about their new island and the inhabitants of it.

#### REMINDERS

SPP is for all Service children identified on the school census and for children of Veterans, for 6 years after the Service person has left the Service. This is known as Ever 6. Many Veterans are not aware of this, so it is encouraged that schools keep websites, leaflets, prospectus' up to date with clear concise and easy to find information on SPP pupils support and the expenditure of SPP.

Schools are accountable for the expenditure of SPP to OFSTED and along with the above suggestions, we are sending out other ways schools can use SPP to support Service children and Veterans.

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
