Accelerated Reader Programme

We use the **Accelerated Reader** programme to **assess the reading ages of students in Year 7 and 8**.

Students will read as a group for one session a week and independently for the other during Tutor time. Students will also have a library lesson once a month during an English lesson.

The Library is also open during break and lunchtimes for anyone to exchange books and read.

Mobile Phones



'We are a no phone school.'

If a pupil decides to bring in a mobile phone they must hand it into their tutor at the start of the day. The phone will then be locked away in the tutor base in a secure safe. Pupils are to return to their tutor room at the end of the day to collect their mobile phone.

A reminder for parents and students that if a mobile phone is used - seen or heard - during the school day, it will be confiscated and the pupil will be placed in a 'same day' 60 minute detention.

Students are reminded that if they need to contact home during the day, this should be done at Welfare or in the Year Office.

- Online portal for pupils and parents to log in and view data and information on: timetable; attendance; behaviour/rewards (including detentions as applicable) and homework
- Login information will be emailed to parents at the start of the new academic year
- Student login codes will be shared directly with students in September 2025

Homework tasks are varied and support the learning in the classroom. They may take the form of a variety of activities, for example:


- Sparx Maths
