Tutor-Time Programme

Each week pupils will have:

- Assembly usually on a Monday morning
- Accelerated Reader Programme one independent and one Tutor-led reading session a week
- Two personal development learning (PDL) sessions per week



Accelerated Reader Programme

At Springfield we aim to develop a culture in which there is a genuine love of reading, where pupils read fluently and are able to understand, interpret and comment on what they have read.

We use the Accelerated Reader programme to assess the reading ages of pupils in Year 7 and 8. Reading ages are measured in years and months. Pupils are assessed termly. The amount pupils are reading and their understanding of these texts is also monitored via Accelerated Reader. Pupils' progress in English will be measured taking reading ages into account.

Once a pupils' reading age is established, they will be able to select appropriate texts from the Library. Each time they finish a book, they can take an Accelerated Reader quiz. This will assess their reading comprehension skills. Pupils are encouraged to read as many books as they can and take lots of quizzes.

Pupils will read as a group for one session a week and independently for the other during Tutor-times. They will also have a library lesson one a month. However, the Library is also open during break and lunchtimes for pupils to exchange books and read.

Ready


- Be on time and in all lessons

Uniform

- Trousers smart, full-length, plain black as directed. No jeans or jean style trousers with back pockets or studs, cords, tracksuit bottoms, leggings or cotton jersey fabric. Trousers should be 'regular fit'

Uniform cont.



- Pupils should not wear nail varnish, false nails or false eyelashes. 'Obvious' make-up is not permitted
- No extreme haircuts or unnatural dyed hair colours are acceptable
- Jewellery a watch and one pair of plain stud earrings are the only items of jewellery permitted





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
